(Simonton family continued from last week.)

Sixth child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton John Simonton Jr. (Nov. 8, 1797-May 18, 1880), married Nancy Brice (Feb. 4 1802-June 28, 1864), daughter of James and Jane Wilson Brice (Nancy's two brothers married into the Simonton family also). Twelve children born to John Jr. and Nancy are: Jane Wilson Simonton (1822-1828); James A. Simonton (1824-1882), buried Micanopy Cemetery, Alachua County, Fl., Dr. Christopher S. Simonton (1826-1854), married Jane Cameron (1830-1860), buried New Hope A.R.P. Cemetery, Fairfield, County, SC; Margaret Jane Simonton (1829-1851) married Rev. E. E. Boyce; Jane Hemphill Simonton (1831-died young); Robert Wilson Simonton (Jan. 1834-June 1834); Mary Emaline Simonton (Oct. 7,1835-?), married David C. Roddey; William Boyce Simonton (Dec. 5, 1837-died Civil War); Martha E. Simonton (Jan. 19, 184X-?); married George Means, Walter B. Simonton (1842-lost leg Civil War); Charles P. Simonton (Feb. 16, 1844-died Civil War). Last child born to John Simonton and Nancy Brice Simonton, Samuel Robert Simonton (July 24, 1848-Oct. 28, 1889), married Sarah E. Harris (Feb. 6, 1853- Mar. 2, 1935), both buried New Hope A.R.P. Cemetery, Fairfield County, SC; U. S. Census 1880 lists these children: John Means Simonton (Sept. 14,1873-?), attorney in Atlanta, Ga., died the early Simonton research, married Eva Johnson in 1901; Marie Simonton (1874); Elizabeth Plume Simonton (1876-1953); William Boyce Simonton (1878-1949); Robert Simonton (not listed on 1880 Census, mentioned in a letter to Mrs. Anthony Walker Sr.), lived in Atlanta, Ga.

Robert and William Simonton and John Thompson were the first to travel the new road from Covington to Shelby County line in 1829.

Seventh child of John Simonton and Margaret Strong Simonton Jennett Simonton (1799-1872) married Alexander Douglass (1799 1863). The Douglass home is still owned by their descendants and located in Douglass community, SC on the road to New Hope A.R.P. Church. Their seven children are: Martha S. Douglass (1826); John S. Douglass (1834-1912), married Margaret 1). Boyce; Jane G. Douglass (1830); Alexander S. Douglass (1833); Margaret S. Douglass (1836), married Rev. J. H. Peoples; Mary E. Douglass (1839), married James Henry Brice; Sarah E. Douglass (1843).

Eighth child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton, Margaret Simonton (1801-1843), married Robert Brice (1791-1871); their 12 children: Jane Wilson Brice (1818-1887), married David Hemphill; Margaret Strong Brice (1820-1843), married Rev. L. McDonald; John Alexander Brice (1822-1890), married Margaret C. Bell first and later Nancy McGinnis; James S. Brice (1824), married Celia M. Bell first and later Elizabeth Moffatt; Robert Wilson Brice (1826-1878), married Anna M. Steele; Christopher Simonton Brice (1828-1908), married Margaret Gooch; Walter Brice, M.D. (1830), practiced in Troy, married Mary E. Anderson; Charles Strong Brice (1831), attorney in Chester SC, married Fannie Henton; Martha Brice(1833-1922), married Prof. Joseph

F. Lee; Sarah Amanda Brice (1835-1894), married Major A. B. Enlee, Troy; Mary Elizabeth Brice married J. Israel Moffatt of Troy, Thomas Scott Brice (1840-1913), married Frances Eliza Adams.

Ninth child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton, James Simonton (1803-1820).

Tenth child of John and Margaret Strong, Martha Simonton (1805-1824).

Eleventh child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton, Alexander Gaston Simonton (1807-1816).

Twelvth child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton, Mary Simonton (Dec, 16, 1809-Jan. 26, 1890), married William Brice (1793-March 9, 1872), who was ruling elder in New Hope A.R.P. Church for 40 years; both buried in New Hope A.R.P. Cemetery, Fairfield County, SC. Their 13 children: Margaret Brice (1831-1868), married Rev. D. P. Robinson; Calvin Brice (1832-1905), married Nancy Ellen Wallace; Robert R. Brice (1834-1861), unmarried; Jane W. Brice (1834-1861), married J. C. Yongue; John P. Brice (1837-1862); James A. Brice (1839-1909), married Josephine McDonald; Martha Brice (1841-1878), married Dr. Thomas Barkley Madden; Mary E. Brice (1843-1895), married John Vinson; William W. Brice (1846-?), married Hattie E. Vinson; Sallie Agnes Brice (1848-?), married J. M. Galloway and are parents of Prof. Louis C. Galloway of Erskin College; Walter H. Brice (1850-1855); infant son (1853); Frances E. Brice (1854-1855).

All children of John and Margaret Strong Simonton remained in South Carolina, except Robert and William who came to Tennessee in 1829 in and bought 700 acres in Tipton County, lying just north of the Shelby County line (Robert's part is now owned by John Simonton Lucado, his great-great-grandson). Robert and William Simonton and John Thompson were the first to travel the new road from Covington to Shelby County line in 1829.

Ninth child of John and Margaret Strong Simonton, James Simonton (1803-1820).

The following is lineal descent from Robert Simonton, first son of John and Margaret Strong Simonton; 10 children of Robert and Margaret McQuiston Simonton are (1) Archibald McQuiston Simonton (1816-1842) married Leticia Strong (1822-1876), one daughter, Margaret Archibald Simonton (1842-1907), married Robert Thomas Wilson (1844-1924), their daughter Mattie Wilson (1866-1949), married S.O. Huey; William J. Wilson (1870-1871); John A. Wilson (1872-192?), James Ross Wilson (1875-1953) married Pattie Hart (1880-1968); Margaret Letticia Wilson (1877-1886); Archibald Simonton Wilson (1880-1881); Robert Todd Wilson (1882-1967) married Ann McQuiston (1894-living); (2) Christopher A. Simonton (1818-?) married Margaret Thompson (1825-1849), dying four months after the birth of son, Hugh Thompson Simonton (1849-1928) who married Ida Mae Waller (1853-1885) no marker has been found for her, Hugh Thompson Simonton buried Munford Cemetery, Covington. Ida May Waller was taken into the home of an uncle, John Reid, after death of her father, Edmond Madison Waller, who died in Civil War. Their children, Christopher Reid Simonton (1873-1951) unmarried was a cotton buyer as was his father, Hugh T. Simonton; Hugh Ernest Simonton (1875-1948) married Mary Bennett Hill, two children: Mary Ida married Sterling G. Cato, Clarence Simonton married Myrtle Sellers. Lucy T. Simonton (1877-1946) married John Taylor Lucado, (1870-1937), eight children born of this union; Claud Buchanan Simonton (1880-1940) married Margaret Fyfe (1882 N.D.-1972) seven children of this union; (Capt. C.B. Simonton had Claud B. Simonton live in his home so he could go to school in the winter months. His daughter, Anna Simonton, helped with Claud's studies.)

(3) Jane Simonton (1820-1843) married John Thompson (1810-890), both buried Salem A.R.P. Cemetery, sons Robert Thompson (1839-1864), died Civil War) unmarried; William Thompson (1841-1923) married Alice Lee Saffell, their son, Edward Allison Thompson (1876-1927), married Luna Cunningham (1882-1947), seven children this union. These are the Rosemark Thompsons.

(4) John Simonton (1823-1885) married Martha A. Miller (1828-no marker found for her). He was buried in Salem A.R.P. Cemetery, Their seven children: Robert C. Simonton (1848-1889) married Amanda Henderson; John M. Simonton (1850-1913) married Julia A. Thompson; William A. Simonton (1855-1878); Christopher A. Simonton (1859-1917) married Mary Madison Purdy (1862-1944), children; Charles Bradley Simonton (1881-1941) married Anna Lanier. Lucile May Simonton (1883-1952) married Joseph Ira Cody, James Purdy

Simonton (1886-1950) married Marianna Walker, John Will Simonton (1889-1958) married Lottye Elizabeth Hutchinson.

Charles Judson Simonton (1862-1921) married Fannie McLaughlin, Mary A. Simonton (1869) married John Fleming, moved to Arkansas; James Lee Simonton (1871-1920) married Delia Simmons.

- (5) Mary McQuiston Simonton (1825-1827) is buried in New Hope A.R.P. Cemetery, Fairfield County, SC.
- (6) Robert Romaine Simonton (1827-1881) married Margaret McQuiston (1828-1869) first, six children: Sarah M, Simonton (1856-1926) married J. Julian Whitley, Robert Simonton (1858-1883), Andrew J. Simonton (1860-1893) married Elizabeth (first name unknown), Archibald R. Simonton (1863-1865), William P. Simonton (1865-1949) married Annie Lee Mauldin, John M. Simonton (1867-?). Second wife was Mary Huffman (1835-1898), their children: Elnora Y. Simonton (1874-1927) married A. Manuel Moose, Spurgeon Simonton (1877-1886), Charles Borum Simonton (1880-1959) married Mattie Florence McQuiston.
- (7) William B. Simonton (1830-1904) married Eliza A. Miller.
- (8) Martha Eliza Simonton (1833-after 1909), unmarried, lived in

the family home with her younger sister.

- (9) Margaret Simonton (1834-after 1879) married Rev. Edward P. Lucado, nine children.
- (10) Charles Judson Simonton (1839-1907) married Nannie E. Thompson, daughter, Margaret Dean Simonton (1866-1925), married Marcus A. Taylor (1867-1947).
